GOAL: PROFICIENCY FOR ALL STUDENTS

► What are the Common Core State Standards?

The Common Core State Standards give us a clear set of learning goals in English language arts and math. They are being used by most states in the country. They show what a student should know and be able to do by the end of each grade. These real - world standards prepare students for success in college, career and life.

Last year, LAUSD students took a practice test of the Smarter Balanced Assessments. This test measures student achievement of Common Core State Standards. Scores from this test are not available for 2013 - 14 but will be reported in coming years.
